2022 In Review

PASTOR

The past year has seen the church move out of pandemic mode to seek a new normal. I am thankful for your faithfulness in supporting Saint Paul's as we move forward while continuing to assess the changes of the last three years. We are decisively back to inperson worship, with a few joining us via the internet or watching the service later in the week. Consistent with a trend emerging in the American church, many people are making it to an in-person service about once a month. Naturally, we hope to see attendance pick up, but we are cognizant of how patterns of life have been disrupted since 2020.

I want to thank the volunteers and staff who enrich life at St. Paul's. Marilyn Robin's leadership in music has seen the choir return. With Sue Collier they are bringing excellent music to our worship experience. Thanks also to those who have signed up to read on Sundays, including Henry Robin who has allowed himself to be drafted to the task numerous times. Thanks also to those who serve, usher, and count. As always, we are grateful for new volunteers who can sign up at the hallway bulletin board; current volunteers are happy to share their skills.

At the invitation of Synod staff, St. Paul's will be engaging in a dialogue with St. Timothy's, Geneseo about the possibility of jointly funding a clergy position. The possible timeframe for this would be Summer 2023, but nothing has been decided as of this writing. I will remain in place until such a transition occurs. Meanwhile, I am grateful to be in your service, and look forward to working together this year for the Kingdom of God.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT

We have made it through the pandemic and trying to get back to normal services and activities even though it won't be the way it was before the pandemic. We have started to help with HOPE lunches. We had a get together with Dean Deibler and discussed the possibility of a shared ministry with St. Timothy. We are going to meet with them this month. I would like to thank everyone that works behind the scenes on the different committees to make our worship services meaningful.

PROPERTY

In the spring of 2022, Henry and Marilyn Robin provided a shed for the storage of a lawn mower. Henry and I mowed the lawn as well as raked leaves to keep the grounds looking good.

Also the roof that was leaking in the sanctuary was repaired by General Roofing and Heating from Wellsville. The contractor stated that the roof was in good shape. So far the roof has not leaked.

Richard Dantz replaced a baseboard heater in the Fellowship Hall. He also installed LED lights in the Sanctuary as well as fixing the timer for the lights that shine on the stained glass windows. He also installed dust to dawn lights on the outside of the Church.

Roger Sutton repaired a valve on the boiler so the insurance company would renew our property insurance in the Spring. Just recently, Isaac Heating came and replaced zone valves in the basement and office.

At the Parsonage, I removed the front section of the picket fence as it was falling apart. The renter has requested some minor repairs to the porch. Bob Whiteman and I replaced some piping in the upstairs bathroom. In the spring, I will get quotes for the blacktop to be sealed at the Parsonage and the Church.

There are many more projects than need attention and hopefully some of them will be completed in the new year.

FINANCE

In 2022 we spent \$12,220.83 more than we received in contributions. We borrowed \$10,000 from our Thrivent Money Market account to help with cash flow. The rental of the parsonage also helps with cash flow. Other than salaries and benefits, our largest maintenance expense continues to be for utilities and snow removal.

In 2022 our electric and gas expenses and snow removal expenses were under budget, but this is mainly due to the fact that the church is rarely open except for Sunday services and necessary Council meetings, as well as a warmer winter with less snow. We did repairs to our sanctuary roofers the area around the steeple was leaking. Various electrical projects were completed throughout the church. Zone valves in various rooms were repaired as some rooms were not receiving heat while other rooms were too hot. The elevette continues to be serviced by Bison Elevator under a monthly contract.

All parsonage expenses (taxes, repairs, insurance) are paid by the rent we receive. Church Council voted to extend the lease we have with our tenant to August 31, 2024.

Through the generosity of our members, donations were made to the following organizations outside of our regular budget -

- ELCA Disaster Relief- Ukraine \$665
- Lutheran World Relief- Ukraine \$61
- Upstate NY Synod World Hunger Campaign \$1,224
- Geneseo Parish Outreach \$146
- Dansville Community Food Pantry \$295
- Dansville High School Backpack Program \$423.19

We did contribute to the Upstate New York Synod's Advent campaign (Comfort Care & Joy) by using the unspent money for budgeted local Benevolence and Pastor's Discretionary accounts. The money collected by Synod will be divided between ELCA Disaster Relief- Ukraine and Upstate NY Synod's Campus Ministries.

Due to covid, the ELCA allowed us to continue spending the grant money we had received for Laundry Love and Moms and Babies. It was a 3-year grant and if not completely spent in that time, the unspent money was to be returned. We did spend out the\$3,587.10 that remained in the grant. We have been able to continue this mission as we have received donations from various individuals and civic clubs that were put into our regular Laundry Love account. We are also continuing to seek other donations. The number of families being served is growing. On a particular Laundry Love day, the number of families participating that day has ranged from 5 to 19. We do thank the 4 volunteers who are not members of our church who help Ann Myers with this program.

The 2023 budget reflects the following:

- A tithe of 10% of total expected contributions to the Upstate New York Synod.
- Increased pay rates for the Sexton and Secretary. Increases in repair expenses to cover the purchase of a new rear door and the removal of two diseased trees on our property.

If all 2023 revenues/expenses are as expected, it is anticipated the church will need to use \$28,982 from our Thrivent accounts to pay our bills. But, I do have faith (as I do every year) that contributions will increase and we will continue to find ways to conserve and reduce the expected budget deficit as 2023 unfolds.
