aturday, October 9th at 2 PM, we will gather in Church Park for the blessing of animals in commemoration of the faith of Saint Francis of Assisi. It seems like Christians of all stripes (as well as non Christians) connect with Francis. Perhaps it it is his reputation for peacemaking, or his avowed connection to God's creation, especially animals, that makes him desirable (for many, Francis is now called the patron saint of ecology). Maybe it is all those Francis statues in pleasant gardens we find in both sacred and secular places. I think it was how he had an abiding faith that wherever he went, the love of God was there. Whatever the reason, even many Christians who do not normally venerate the saints find something likable in the friar from Assisi. That said, veneration is not emulation. One biography of the saint puts it thusly:

Francis, the son of a prosperous merchant of Assisi, was born in 1182. His early youth was spent in harmless revelry and fruitless attempts to win military glory. Various encounters with beggars and lepers pricked the young man's conscience, however, and he decided to embrace a life devoted to Lady Poverty. ...Of all the saints, Francis is perhaps the most popular and admired but probably the least imitated; few have attained to his total identification with the poverty and suffering of Christ. (Lesser Feasts and Fasts, 2018, The Episcopal Church)

We love the idea of a saint devoted to service who was not afraid to get his hands dirty, but as a general rule, society prefers others to do the proverbial dirty work, whatever that may be. Or we have a fondness for moments of service in between generous stretches spent in secure, comfortable places. Yet Francis is a reminder that one need not be superhuman to serve the poor, nor does one need to be "pure" as such to connect with God's created, beloved world. One need only be committed. Indeed, if we are perfected at all, it is by our Christian engagement with the world, not withdrawing from it. In fact, if we press into God's beloved world, we may well find that God has been awaiting us there all along, among his creatures and all who are in need.

Having our beloved animals blessed is a reminder to us that all the world is *brimming* with the love of God; the opportunity to experience the transforming grace of Christ is an abundant gift of God, rather than a scarce commodity. So please bring your animal(s) (or a picture thereof if your animal is not so easily transported) to Church Park this Saturday for a blessing, as we give thanks for the example of Francis, and redouble our efforts to follow Jesus as he and so many faithful have done before, in this, God's beloved world.
